

Aztecs Academy

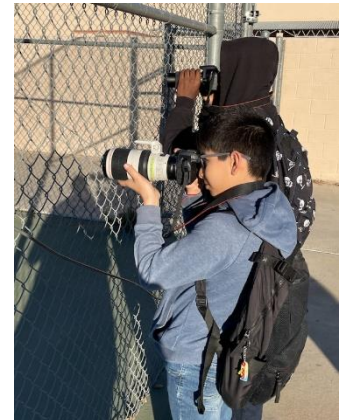
The Copper Canyon Aztecs Academy is an after-school program for students of all grade levels. A variety of classes are offered throughout the year that focus on Math, ELA, and building connections on campus. All classes are led by our highly motivated Copper Canyon staff.



Sample of Classes

Aztecs Academy offers a variety of classes. Currently, the following classes are being offered:

- **Building Relationships Through Sports** – Learn how to be a great teammate and build connections through volleyball, basketball, soccer, and other team sports.
- **DIY Projects** – Create art projects, hands-on crafts, and much more with provided materials.
- **Monty's Kitchen** – Learn the basics of culinary while making food, desserts, and snacks!
- **Drone and Sports Photography** – Jump in the action of Aztec media by taking pictures, marketing, and developing reading comprehension and writing skills.
- **Gaming from the Ground Up** – Play a variety of video games solo or in teams. Did someone say Nintendo Switch?
- **Making Math Fun** – Improve your math skills through fun activities and an intro to robotics.



Program Objectives

Academic

- 1.1 Math – 50% of students who attend 30 days or more will pass their math class with a grade of a “C” or higher at the end of the semester, as evidenced by report card grades.
- 1.2 Reading/ELA – 50% of students who attend 30 days or more will improve their reading score by at least 1 grade level from fall to spring as evidenced by district approved testing.

Youth Development

- 2.1 Relationship – 80% of 21st CCLC regular 30-day attendees will have developed a connection to other students, faculty, and staff as evidenced by a pre and post survey.

Family Engagement

- 30% of 21st CCLC regular attendees students' families will attend 3 or more school activities that will have contributed to their children's academic and/or social development as evidenced by a student/parent survey and/or attendance reports.
